Prime Minister Napat Highlights Strategic Leadership as Director Generals Sign 2025 Performance Agreements

On May 30th, 2025, Director Generals across government ministries signed the new 2025 Performance Agreements, launched by the Office of the Public Service Commission (OPSC) to boost accountability, efficiency, and leadership in the public sector.

Prime Minister Jotham Napat called DGs the “brain of the government,” urging them to adopt strategic leadership focused on innovation, long-term vision, and sustainable governance. The updated agreements align ministry goals with the National Sustainable Development Plan (NSDP) and emphasize clear objectives and measurable results.

The Chairman of the Public Service Commission, Mr. Martin Mahe reaffirmed PSC’s commitment to supporting DGs in achieving their objectives, reinforcing a culture of excellence, collaboration, and continuous improvement within the government.

DGs will be required to submit quarterly update reports every three months, ensuring ongoing performance tracking and accountability-that will be done in a face-to-face presentation with the Prime Minister and the Chairman of the PSC. These updates will provide insights into key achievements, challenges, and future initiatives, reinforcing continuous improvement and effective decision-making.
